Collierville has experienced extreme growth over the past two decades, seeing a 31.6% increase in population from 2000 to 2010 and 9.6% from 2010 to 2020. While projections show growth will slow over the next five years, that rate continues to outpace the projected growth for Shelby County and the Memphis MSA.

The **Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services** sector requires workers with higher education. Collierville has a significantly higher percentage of its age 25+ population with bachelor's degrees, master's degrees, and beyond, at nearly 60%. Because of this, it is unsurprising that this industry has a strong presence in Collierville.



The Manufacturing sector has grown at the highest rate out of any of the key economic sectors. The jobs are spread evenly throughout various forms of manufacturing, with the highest concentrations in Food; Beverage and Tobacco; Apparel; Chemical; and Electrical Equipment Manufacturing.



Construction is one of Collierville's fastest growing sectors. Specialty Trade contractors make up a significant portion of this sector.




